On behalf of Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services (SFBFS), we are writing this letter in support of TWO MEN AND A TRUCK Sacramento for the American Moving & Storage Association Independent Mover of the Year Award. Since 2007, we have shared a healthy partnership that has been directly responsible for strengthening families and giving people a "hand up" in our community.

SFBFS is a private non-profit with a 32 year history of alleviating people's immediate pain and problems and moving them toward self sufficiency and financial independence. This is accomplished through 11 different programs focused on basic human services, education and support. Collectively, SFBFS' programs impact over 1,000 people daily. Our largest program is Food Assistance. Through this program, we collect and distribute over 4.3 million pounds of emergency take-home groceries each year; serving over 16,000 men, women and children each month.

TWO MEN AND A TRUCK Sacramento has been instrumental in helping with our Annual Holiday Spirit of Giving (SOG) Food Drive. The Holiday SOG Food Drive is a collaborative effort of over 350 businesses that help collect emergency food for local families in need. The most important part of the drive is the coordination and delivery of food collection barrels to participating locations. Over the last two years, TWO MEN AND A TRUCK Sacramento has performed all donation barrel drop-offs and pickups helping to make the drive a lasting success.

More specifically, TWO MEN AND A TRUCK has helped save our organization over \$20,000 in operational costs. We pride ourselves on the fact that our organization can turn every dollar donated into ten dollars worth of products and services to local underserved families. The \$20,000 in labor and resources donated by TWO MEN AND A TRUCK was turned into \$200,000 to support our community. Furthermore, their efforts were directly responsible for collecting over 600,000 pounds of food that was distributed to over 30,000 families.

SFBFS' programs are sustained by individuals and businesses in our community. Our Food Assistance program would not be as effective without dedicated partners like TWO MEN AND A TRUCK Sacramento. The owner, Mark Snyir is compassionate about giving back to the community and his professionalism and sincerity shows in his work and the efforts of his staff.
